# **Appendix 3: Detailed Transcription Data from the Interview**

#### **First Question**

Q1: Can you describe your strategies for learning new vocabulary while watching English pop culture movies?

No.	Subject	Answer
1.	Student 1	I pay attention to how words are used in context. This helps me understand the vocabulary meaning. I watch scenes multiple times to reinforce new words and phrases. And sometimes, I note down unfamiliar words or phrases and look them up after the movie. I also pause and rewind to focus on specific dialogues or phrases. To understand it better, I start with Indonesian subtitles and then switch to English subtitles. Finally, I like to challenge myself to watch movies without subtitles.
2.	Student 2	I usually use English subtitles for my learning strategies, so I can note down and identify what is being said, and I can guess the meaning of the new vocabulary I encounter in the movie, and then finally look up their meaning if I don't get what it means from guessing.
3.	Student 3	I use my favorite movie so I can enjoy myself while learning, and I use English subtitles so my listening and reading skills can also improve.
4.	Student 4	I do not have specific strategies. However, it has become my habit that the new vocabulary, especially unfamiliar words I encountered during the movies, will automatically stick in my mind, and somehow, I will remember which movie I encountered it from as this method is only accidental (indirect) vocabulary acquisition for me. I use Indonesian as my subtitle, as it directly translates into my language so that I can better comprehend the meaning of words and sentences. Sometimes, I look up idioms or slang that I am unsure about its meaning in my language.
5.	Student 5	When I find new vocabulary, I usually memorize it, repeat it in my mind or out loud, and connect it with a similar word. Then, look it up in the dictionary or Google Translate, especially in pop culture English movies, which usually provide a lot of intriguing vocabulary to learn. Harry Potter movies, for example, have a British accent and offer many new vocabulary materials.
6.	Student 6	I mention, repeat, and try to memorize the new vocabulary I encounter, and then I usually guess its meaning by listening to how the word is used in a context, but if I don't grasp the meaning, I directly look up its meaning to understand more. I create sentences from it to ensure I remember the new vocabulary. Sometimes, I use double subtitles, English and Indonesian, while watching movies to understand and learn more new vocabulary.
7.	Student 7	I do this with so many movies, so I don't stop getting exposed to the language. I use English subtitles so I won't miss any context in the movies. I like to use trending and popular movies to keep up with what's happening. It exposed me to various cultures, slang, idioms, and so much new vocabulary as it presented different

To overcome this challenge, I usually rewind the clips and use subtitles to make them easier to understand. I also watched the movie comprehensively to understand it better and sometimes rewatch it.
7.	Student 7	I think it's when the actors talk too fast; sometimes I miss what they say, and when there's an actor with a certain accent that is hard to understand. I use subtitles to overcome this and playback the scene until I understand their meaning.
8.	Student 8	I find it hard when encountering too much unfamiliar vocabulary from the movies, which sometimes makes me forget the meaning later. So, to overcome this, I like to rewatch movies until I get the meaning from the repetition of the movies. I started using Indonesian subtitles until I became familiar with the vocabulary, then changed to English for better understanding, and eventually, I did not use any subtitles to keep improving.
9.	Student 9	Sometimes, movies use a lot of cultural references or humor that I don't understand. It can be confusing when I don't get the joke or the context. To overcome this, I research the cultural references online or discuss them with friends who are more familiar with American or British culture. This helps me learn more about the culture behind the language and makes it easier to understand future movies.
10.	Student 10	I find it difficult when movies have overlapping dialogue or background noise that makes it hard to hear the words clearly.
